DESCRIPTION OF THE DISTRICT

The Cheyenne-Eagle Butte Cooperative School system is located in Eagle Butte, South Dakota, on the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation. This combined school system (District #20-1 and the Bureau of Indian Affairs) was formed in 1960, when the Cheyenne Agency was relocated to the town of Eagle Butte as a result of the Oahe Dam project.

The Combined School Board was established through a cooperative agreement between the BIA and the Public School District to provide the governance needed to provide for an equitable educational opportunity for students attending the overall combined system in Eagle Butte. This cooperative agreement specifies the responsibility of both educational systems toward serving all students in the immediate area. The combined school board is represented by seven (7) school board members from the public school board and the seven (7) from the 95-561 (BIA) school board. This combined school system allows for cooperative utilization of facility, funding, staff and other resources contained within the overall education system.

The combined school system is organized into a Primary (K-2), Upper Elementary (3-6), Junior High (7-8), High School (9-12) and E.A.G.L.E Center, alternative school (6-12.)
